In ministering Communion to people in a health care setting, particular considerations to be taken into account include:

- Liaison with health care staff
- Oral intake fasting or 'nil by mouth'
- The degree of pain or discomfort the patient may be suffering
- Possible shyness on the part of the patient in a public setting
- How to create a prayerful space, e.g by drawing a curtain
- How to celebrate the rite reverently in a shared space.

#### It is desirable that:

- A suitable place be prepared
- That there is a glass of water nearby in case the patient needs to drink after receiving the host
- There be a period of silence after Communion
- A copy of the prayers be left to connect the patient with the community.

#### Ministers will be aware of the need to:

- Maintain confidentiality and appropriate boundaries at all times
- Ensure that proper infection control measures are taken as circumstances require.

#### The Ministers and their attributes

Ministers of communion for the sick are made up of Lay Chaplains, Priests, Volunteers and Pastoral Care staff. In a particular way they manifest faith and charity on behalf of the whole community and like all liturgical ministers, ministers of Communion to the sick are:


- Baptised Catholics active in the life of the church
- Faithful to the church's mandate
- Good hearted men and women motivated by a desire to serve.

### More particularly they are blessed with:

- Compassion for the sick
- The ability to adapt to diverse and changing circumstances
- Respect for the sick person's rhythm of rest, meals and medication.



Ministry of Communion to the Sick



In a health care setting, ministering Communion to the sick can be healing and comforting. It is approached carefully and respectfully.

Communion ministry is available in the hospital each weekday and on Sunday mornings by pastoral care staff and visiting teams of volunteers: "Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion".
